s mandated by the U.S. Constitution, America gets just one chance each decade to count its population.

The U.S. Census counts every resident in the United States. It is mandated by Article I, Section 2 of the Constitution and takes place every 10 (ten) years. The data collected by the decennial census determine the number of seats each state has in the U.S. House of Representatives (a process called apportionment) and is also used to distribute billions in federal funds to local communities.

The decennial census is the largest mobilization and operation conducted in the United States and requires years of research, planning and development of methods and infrastructure to ensure an accurate and complete count.

The next Census in 2020 will require counting an increasingly diverse and growing population of around 330 million people in more than 140 million housing units. To get an accurate count, the Census Bureau must build an accurate address list of every housing unit, maximize self-response to the census, and efficiently follow up with those who do **United States** not respond.

The census asks questions of people in homes and group living situations, including how many people live or stay in each home, and the sex, age and race of each person. The goal of the 2020 Census is to count everyone once, only once and in the right place.

Federal funds, grants and support to states, counties and communities are based on population totals and breakdowns by sex, age, race and other factors. Our community benefits the most when the census counts everyone. When you respond to the census, you help our community get its fair share of the more than \$675 billion per year in federal funds spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.

Businesses use census data to decide where to build factories, offices and stores, and this creates jobs. Developers use the census to build new homes and revitalize old neighborhoods. Local governments use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness. Residents use the census to support community initiatives involving legislation, quality-of-life and consumer advocacy.

We look forward to the 2020 Census! Because of the potential benefits our community could receive, we encourage that you stand up and be counted!

New Year's Day Tuesday, January 1, 2019 The following are highlights of actions taken by the City Council at their meetings from January through June, 2018.

- Ratified Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Greenacres and the Professionals Firefighters Union IAFF through September 2020.
- City of Greenacres Fire Rescue received Statewide Chad Reed First Responder Award at the 2018 Governor's Hurricane Conference.
- Authorized the FY 2019 School Readiness Agreement and the Children's Services Council (CSC) Scholarship Program Provider Agreement with the Early Learning Coalition of Palm Beach County for the City's Afterschool Program.
- Amended the FY 2017 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Agreement for Phase 5 of the Stormwater Drainage Enhancement Project in the Original Section.
- Awarded the 2016 President's Volunteer Service Awards to twenty-two (22) volunteers that donated their time, energy and care to the community serving a total of 8,410 hours.
- Presented the five (5) Educational Scholarship Awards to resident students as recommended by the City's Scholarship Committee.
- Awarded nine (9) Teacher Appreciation Awards one from each school in Greenacres.
- Authorized an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County for reimbursement of emergency medical services equipment.
- Awarded a bid for Original Section Drainage Improvements to reduce flooding, improve performance and reduce maintenance.
- Approved the Capital Improvements Element of the City's Comprehensive Plan.
- Approved the Site Plan for a one-story Aldi's Grocery Store building on the northwest corner of Chickasaw Road and south Jog Road.
- Approved agreement for the Textile Recycling and Collection Bin Program to provide containers where residents can donate gently used or unwanted clothing for reuse or recycling purposes.



Approved City Budget - Fiscal Year 2019

The City Council scheduled public hearings on September 6^h and 20th at 6:00 p.m. to adopt a budget for Fiscal Year 2019 *(October 1, 2018 – September 30, 2019)*. The City's proposed general operating budget for FY2019 is \$28.9 million, which is \$2.173 million more than the Fiscal Year 2018 budget.

The increase is mostly due to an increase in interfund transfers into the Capital Project Funds. The proposed FY2019 budget includes funding to enhance Fire Rescue services, and Leisure Services activities and events.

Each August, the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office sends a Notice of Proposed Property Taxes to all property owners showing the taxable value of the property and the property tax information for all taxing authorities. Of the total property tax bill, the City's property tax portion represents approximately 27% with the remaining 73% going to the County, School District, and other independent taxing authorities.

> Palm Tran is the primary public transit operator of Palm Beach County.

> To improve Palm Trans network to better meet the mobility needs of the growing population in the County, they have implemented a Route **Performance Maximization (RPM)** Initiative which will simplify routes and make service more direct.

> Changes to routes are expected to begin on September 30, 2018. Riders will see improved evening and weekend service and have more convenient connections. There will also be WiFi available on fixed bus routes.

> Routes in the City will not be reduced or eliminated. Two (2) routes will be extended as part of the RPM. Route 64 will be extended West to the Department of Welfare Office (WIC) and Route 63 will be extended North along Jog Road to Forest Hill Boulevard.

Pulsepoint

Imagine you and a loved one are at the local hardware store and the unthinkable happens. Your spouse suffers a Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) and you call 911. Moreover, the supermarket next door has an AED, and there are persons within the shopping center who are trained in CPR and the use of an AED. However, none of them respond to help nor get the AED because they are not aware the event is happening. For every minute that goes by without CPR, your loved ones chance of survival decreases by 10%. Therefore, every second counts.

So how do you call 911, notify those CPR trained persons that a Sudden Cardiac Arrest victim needs their help, and where the nearest AED is? The answer is, PulsePoint Respond. The PulsePoint Respond. App allows users who have been trained in CPR, and willing to assist in case of an emergency, to be simultaneously notified with the dispatch of emergency crews to the medical emergency. User notification only occurs after the 9-1-1 System has been activated and when they are within close proximity to the emergency.

The application also directs these citizen rescuers to the exact location of the closest publicly accessible AED. The City of Greenacres Fire Rescue has been using this system for more than three (3) months and is already realizing incredible benefits. Often, data on AED locations can be missing, inaccurate, or simply not detailed enough to make the devices easy to find in an emergency. That's where the PulsePoint AED App comes in.



PulsePoint AED lets you report and update AED locations so that emergency responders, including nearby citizens trained in CPR and off-duty professionals such as firefighters, police officers and nurses, can find an AED close to them when a cardiac emergency occurs. The AEDs that you locate and report using PulsePoint AED are also made available to local dispatchers in the emergency communication center, allowing them to direct callers to the nearby life-saving devices.

PulsePoint Respond and PulsePoint AED are powerful tools in our efforts to increase survival rates in the City of Greenacres - and both are completely free. As an added bonus, users can see important emergency activity in real time. These informational notifications provide an early and automatic heads-up to local threats such as wildland fires, flooding, vehicle accidents, and utility emergencies. Improving situational awareness with PulsePoint can help build safer, stronger, and more resilient communities. Will you join us and become a citizen hero? The life saved, could be your own. Passport Application Acceptance Facility

The City of Greenacres, in partnership with the U.S. Department of State, Passport Division, now offers a convenient location to apply for a U.S. Passport at City Hall.

The City began accepting Passport applications in March 2018. After construction was completed inside City Hall to provide a more customer friendly environment when submitting the applications, a ribbon cutting was held on July 2nd to officially open the new Passport Application Office. Several certified agents are available to assist with the application process and the City also provides photographs for an additional fee. One-Penny Surtax

In November 2016, Palm Beach County voters approved a One-Penny Sales Surtax to be used to fund infrastructure repairs, restorations and replacements, and maintain current levels of service in our School District, County and the City of Greenacres.

The City of Greenacres will receive an estimated \$23,000,000 over the ten-year period. To ensure that the City is being good stewards of these dollars the City Council felt it was important to fund projects that would not only aesthetically improve the City, but would also provide for projects that would enhance the quality of life for our residents. The City began budgeting projects in Fiscal Year 2017, and to date the following are some of the projects that have been completed:


