2017 Municipal General Election Notice

The City of Greenacres Municipal General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, March 14, 2017. Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. City voters will have the opportunity to elect candidates for Office of the Mayor, and City Council Districts I and V. Voting for Council Districts is city-wide regardless of the district in which you live.



Individuals who have filed to run for office on March 14, 2017, will be placed on the ballot by the close of the qualifying and filing period at Noon on February 14, 2017.

To register to vote, a Voter Registration Form must be completed and submitted to the PBC Supervisor of Elections Office. These forms are available at City Hall and online at www.pbcelections.org. The deadline to register to vote on Election Day is Noon on February 13, 2017.

Voters choosing to cast their vote by Absentee Ballot may submit an online request on the PBC Supervisor of Elections' website at www.pbcelections. org. A request may also be made by phone at (561) 656-6200 or by fax at (561) 656-6220. Carefully read the instructions for absentee ballots and be sure to sign the back of the ballot, apply the correct postage and submit the ballot to ensure receipt by the Supervisor of Elections Office prior to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

- Approved two (2) Site Plan Amendments for the Greenacres Nissan located at 5385 Lake Worth Road.
- * Approval of the plat for Whitney Park located at 4924 2nd Street on the north side of Bowman Street approximately 300 feet east of Haverhill Road.

On November 8, 2016, Palm Beach County voters approved a One-Penny Sales Surtax to fund infrastructure repairs, restorations and replacements, and maintain current levels of service in our School District, County and the City of Greenacres.

The surtax will commence January 1, 2017, and automatically sunset on December 31, 2026. The City of Greenacres will receive an estimated \$23,000,000.00 over the ten-year period. For Fiscal Year 2017, The City is proposing the following projects:

- ** City-Wide Sidewalk Enhancements at Dahl Drive, Dodd Road, Lake Worth Hills, Wry Road/Ramblewood Circle, Villa Del Trio, South 57th Avenue and Sherwood Forest Blvd., to complete missing segments and provide connections to allow for safe movement throughout the City.
- Replacement of the large play structure with the addition of a rubberized surface and shading surrounding the play structure at Community Hall.
- Upgrading of outdoor lighting with LED light fixtures at the pathway of Bowman Park, parking lot lights at Fire Rescue Station 94/PBSO District 16, Fire Rescue Station 95 and Municipal Complex and pathway and parking lot lights at Veterans Park to increase visibility and provide safer conditions for drivers and pedestrians. Electricity consumption is estimated to be reduced by 75% as a result of this upgrade.
- Replacement of a 25-year-old school bus in our Youth Programs Division with a 30-passenger bus.
- Analysis, surveying and engineering design work for a project that would provide for stabilization of approximately 2,400 linear feet of lake bank and littoral zone that provides drainage for the residences adjacent to Gladiator Circle, Toga Way, Chariot Circle and Empire Way, south of Toga Way.

The City of Greenacres is committed to being good stewards of these funds to provide projects that enhance the quality of life for our residents.

Christmas came early during the month of December 2016 at the City of Greenacres CARES program. Wes Kain, co-star of the Vanilla Ice Project, dropped into the City of Greenacres Leisure Services aftercare program and donated items for the center. Mr. Kain toured and visited the facility back in September and spoke to the children about making good choices and dreaming big. He grew up in Greenacres, Florida and was impressed with the Gold Star facility and the programs they offer. "They didn't have anything like this when I was growing up." he said. He had asked if the center needed anything and was provided a list of items.

The Director of Leisure Services, Michele Thompson, and Youth Supervisor Jowie Mohammed had about 50 children present when Mr. Kain donated the items and spoke to the kids. He again reiterated that if you make good choices, your opportunities are limitless. And he talked about giving back and paying it forward.

The most moving moment was when a young boy, Christian, asked to speak. He thanked Mr. Kain for coming and said that he really appreciated Wes thinking of the kids in Greenacres when he could be anywhere and because he was famous. He said that the items donated are important, but that his taking the time to come back was very important. Community Hall may be the only place the kids get to have the chance to play an Xbox or watch a movie on a big TV. He then called Wes a real "home town hero" and said he had real character. The two hugged and it was a very emotional moment for everyone. Many gathered for a group photo afterwards. Mr. Kain stated he would be back again...Greenacres is a great place to live!







SpraySafe & Stay Safe

In an effort to protect residents and visitors to our parks, Greenacres is one of the first municipalities in the County to install Spray Safe insect repellent machines. The Spray Safe system utilizes insect repellent that is biodegradable, non-toxic and certified organic. Users will swipe their credit card to pay the \$2.00 fee and will have 30 seconds to spray all exposed body parts. Machines will be located at Freedom Park, Community Park, Ira Van Bullock Park and Veterans Park.



- ► Hours of Operation: School year, 2:00 p.m. 6:00 p.m.; School holidays and Summer, 7:30 a.m. 6:00 p.m.
- Transportation provided daily from Greenacres, Greenacres Christian, Liberty Park, Cholee Lake, Heritage, and Diamond View Elementary Schools.
- Enrichment activities include: homework assistance, computers, athletics, music classes, cooking, gardening, cultural/civic education, art activities, field trips, movies, swimming, bowling, skating, and much more.
- A \$35 registration fee is required (per household), effective October 1, 2016.
- Monthly program fees apply (Early Learning Coalition subsidized childcare funding accepted or private pay).

COOL ZONE

A year-round safe, supervised, comfortable and educational environment for 6th, 7th and 8th grade students.

- Participants who qualify as a Youth Mentor/Counselor in Training (CIT) may attend Monday through Friday 3:30 – 6:00 p.m.
- The Hot Spot Advisory Council enables members to earn volunteer hours required for high school graduation. Advisory Council members also have an opportunity to plan and attend special field trips.
- The annual registration fee is \$35 per student.
