



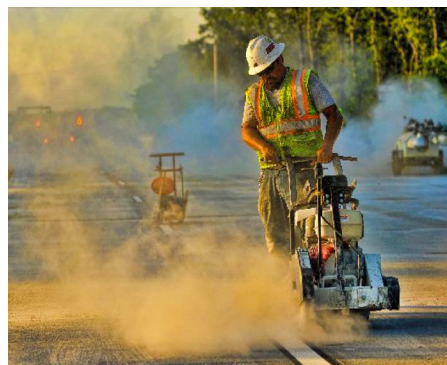

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next ten (10) years. That funding shapes many different aspects of every community, no matter the size, no matter the location.

Census Results Affect Planning & Funding for:

Education—including programs such as Head Start, Pell Grants, school lunches, rural education, adult education, and grants for preschool special education.

Infrastructure—including programs for highway planning and construction, Section 8 housing, federal transit, community development, and rural water and waste disposal systems.

Healthcare—including programs such as Medicaid, Medicare Part B, State Children’s Health Insurance, and the prevention and treatment of substance abuse.

Employment and training—including programs for vocational rehabilitation state grants, dislocated workers, and American Indian and Alaska Native employment and training.

The 2020 Census will determine congressional representation. The results will determine the number of seats each state has in the House of Representatives. They are also used to draw congressional and state legislative districts. The results will also show where communities need new schools, new clinics, new roads, and more services for families, older adults, and children.

Surtax Projects

YOUR PENNY AT WORK



In November 2016, Palm Beach County voters approved a ballot issue to levy a One-Cent Infrastructure Sales Surtax to pay for the acquisition or improvements to public infrastructure. Listed below are various improvement projects that have been or will soon be undertaken by the City of Greenacres utilizing Surtax funds.



City Entryway Monument Signs

The existing aluminum City entryway signs will be replaced with monument style signs to upgrade the aesthetics of the City and provide for a uniform look.



City Parks Improvements

Ongoing repairs / improvements of various City Parks to include converting baseball/softball fields to soccer fields, a larger gazebo, bankshot basketball system, additional parking, and upgrading play structures including rubberized surfacing. Improvements will be developed in several phases until completed.



Citywide Sidewalk Improvements

Upgrade sidewalk system to complete missing segments and create sidewalk networks to allow for safe movement and mobility for our residents, especially children walking to and from school.



Dillman Trail

Develop a twelve-foot wide multi-use pathway within an existing right-of-way, to allow an alternative route between Dillman Road and Forest Hill Boulevard which connects three (3) schools.



Median Landscaping Rejuvenation

Design/upgrade appropriate landscape treatment for the City's unirrigated roadway medians.



Original Section Drainage Improvements

Enhancement of the existing stormwater drainage system in the Original Section by increasing the storage capacity and conveyance effectiveness of existing alleys through excavation and grading, to improve performance and reduce maintenance.

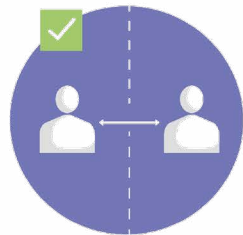

COVID-19

As the pandemic continues, we must maintain safe practices that reduce the potential for exposure to this virus. Because COVID-19 is highly transmissible and can be spread by people who do not know they have the disease, practicing healthy hygiene will help lower the risk of spreading the disease. Wear a mask when out in public, wash your hands often, use hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol, and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.

Know how it Spreads

- + The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to this virus.
- + The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person:
 - + Between people who are in close contact with one another (within about 6 feet).
 - + Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes or talks.
 - + These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.
- + Some recent studies have suggested that COVID-19 may be spread by people who are not showing any symptoms.

Wash Your Hands Often

- + Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.

Clean & Disinfect

- + Clean AND disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks.

Wear a Mask

- + You could spread COVID-19 to others even if you do not feel sick.
- + The mask is meant to protect other people in case you are infected.
- + Everyone should wear a mask in public settings and when around people who don't live in your household, especially when other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain.

Avoid Close Contact

Inside your home:

- + Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- + If possible, maintain 6 feet between the person who is sick and other household members.

Outside your home:

- + Put 6 feet of distance between yourself and people who don't live in your household.
- + Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.
- + Stay at least 6 feet (*about 2 arms' length*) from other people. Keeping distance from others is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick.

Cover Your Mouth & Nose

- + Always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze or use the inside of your elbow and do not spit.
- + Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

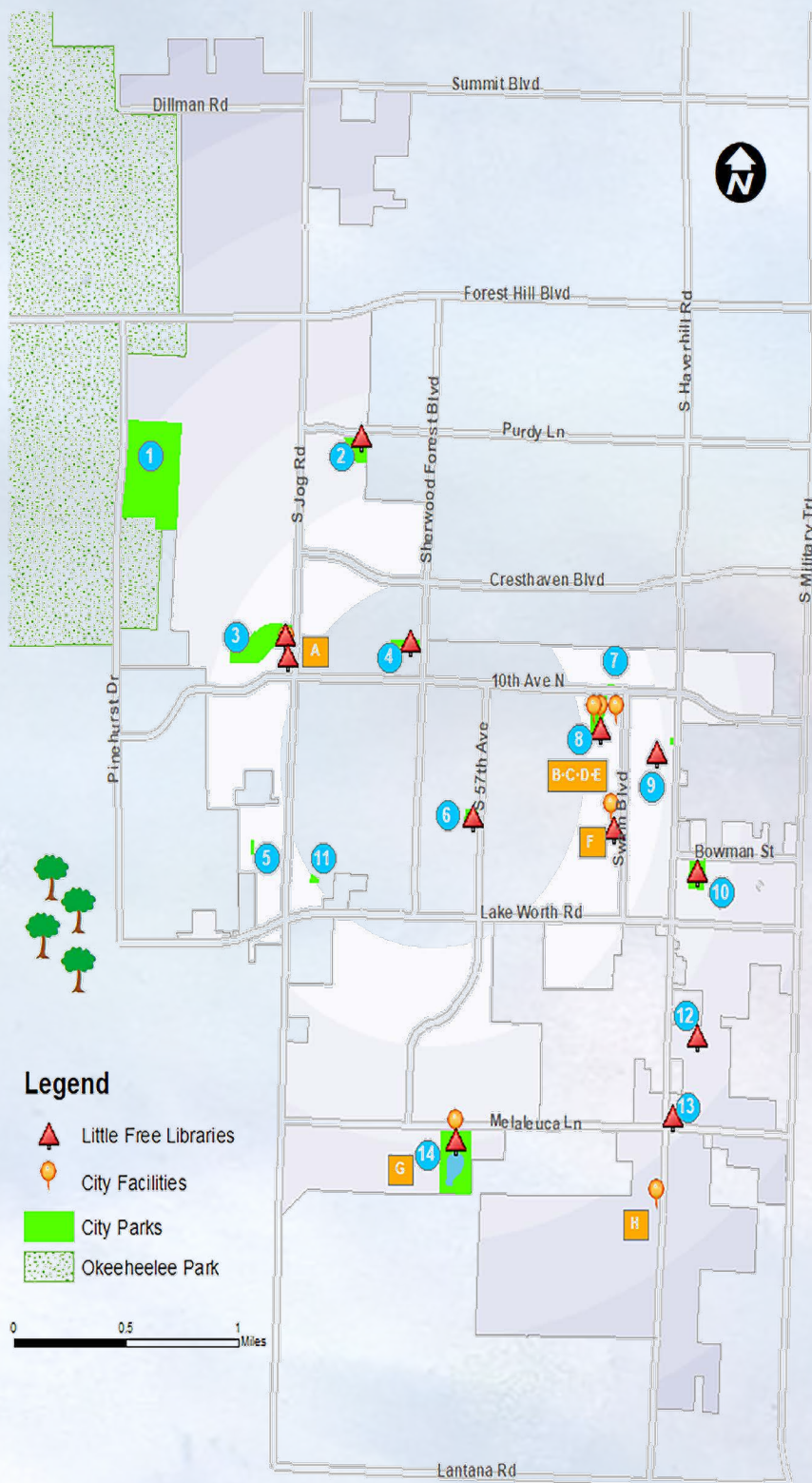

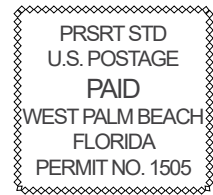
