ARE YOU READY FOR HURRICANE SEASON?



Planning and preparation are vital to the City in handling emergencies such as hurricanes. During the 2004 hurricane season, the City implemented its Emergency Management Plan twice in response to the two hurricanes that impacted our area. Listed below is a brief summary of the actions taken by the City during hurricanes.




- ★ Basic City operations continue during all phases of an emergency.
- ★ Critical employees report to the City's Emergency Operations Center at Public Safety.
- ★ Public Safety employee's carry out evacuation orders in mandatory evacuation zones (City evacuation zones are the mobile home parks).
- ★ Critical care residents are transported to PBC SpecialCare Unit at the South Florida Fair Grounds.
- ★ Building personnel inspect construction job sites to ensure that construction materials are secure.
- ★ Public Works secures city buildings and grounds which include:
 - o Shuttering/securing 17 buildings
 - o Removing Flags
 - o Ensuring fuel supply is adequate
 - Fueling and securing City vehicles (90 vehicles)
- ★ Waste collection:
 - o Waste services will cease when the SWA closes the landfills (approximately 12-24 hours prior to a storm)
- ★ Public Safety Officers will respond to all calls until the point that is it no longer safe for personnel to be out in the storm.



Response and Recovery Actions

- ★ Coordinate with the County Emergency Operations.
- ★ Begin rescue operations.
- ★ Survey City for damages.
- ★ Enforce curfew regulations.
- ★ Clear City maintained streets of debris.
- ★ Conduct damage assessment of public facilities and grounds.
- ★ Coordinate debris removal.
- ★ Repair/secure damaged City buildings and grounds.
- ★ Clear City drainage systems.
- ★ Conduct Damage Assessments of residences and businesses.
- ★ Complete State Damage Assessment forms indicating extent of damage and estimated cost to repair.
- ★ Issue emergency permits for temporary repairs to structures.
- ★ Coordinate volunteer activities.
- ★ Assist at distribution sites.
- ★ Assist with City facility and grounds clean-up.
- ★ Disseminate information.
- ★ Prepare FEMA reimbursement forms.





Generators 101

Here are a few guidelines for operating generators to keep in mind:

★ Never operate a generator in a garage or any other enclosed or partially enclosed space. Generators produce an odorless gas that can be fatal if inhaled.



- ★ Gasoline for generators may be stored in a garage provided it is stored in approved containers and does not exceed 10 gallons for single-family homes or 25 gallons for multi-family homes.
- ★ Fixed generators (also referred to as whole-house generators) are installed in permanent outdoor locations. A building permit is required for these fixed generators.



★ Fixed generators are commonly run on either LP gas or diesel fuel. LP gas tanks may only be installed outdoors, either above ground or below ground. LP storage tanks may never be located indoors or in garages. Diesel fuel, on the other hand, may be stored inside garages provided it is stored in approved containers and provided the total amount stored does not exceed 60 gallons.



PBC Registration For The Special Care Unit

There are many citizens in Palm Beach County who have serious medical problems or who may reside in high-risk areas and cannot safely remain in their homes if our county experiences a hurricane event like the hurricanes of 2004. Those who meet the required medical criteria and are registered will be transported to a centrally located facility where they will be under the medical supervision of physicians and registered nurses. Applicants must meet the following criteria to obtain approval of admittance to the Special Care unit:



- 1. Persons who cannot be without electricity because they depend upon an electrically energized life support.
- 2. Persons that are immobile and/or have chronic stable illness but are not suitable for regular shelter.
- 3. Insulin diabetics who depend on refrigeration for their insulin.



4. Persons who are bedridden and require custodial care. Caregivers are allowed with patients.

Homeowner Association Hurricane Emergency Checklist

Does your Homeowner's Association have an Emergency Plan? The following checklist outlines some basic consideration for your Plan.

PREPARATION:

- Review and safeguard Insurance and other Association documents.
- Negotiate terms for debris/vegetation removal with landscape contractor or other contractors.
- Establish contact list for board members/ management company personnel.
- Prune trees before June 1st .
- Inspect and clean drainage systems including inlets, pipes, and outfall structures.
- Compile list of residents that may need assistance before and after a hurricane.
- Install shutters on common area buildings (clubhouse).
- Remove or secure all loose items on common property including flags.
- Secure recycling containers and close lids of dumpsters. (Do not turn dumpsters on their sides!)

AFTER THE STORM:

- Check on neighbors
- Conduct a quick damage assessment (buildings, flooding, fallen trees)
- Watch for fallen power lines before clearing storm drain inlets of leaves and other vegetation, which will allow storm water to drain.
- Contact Management Company and arrange for clearing and debris removal.
- Monitor radio/TV for important information regarding conditions.

Residents' Hurricane Emergency Checklist

PREPARATION:

- Establish an Emergency Plan and prepare you Family Disaster Kit (water, food, first aid supplies, clothing, bedding, tool and emergency supplies, and special items). The Emergency Plan and the contents for the kit are detailed in the Hurricane Survival Guide kit available at local supermarkets, or online at www.redcross-pbc.org (view Disaster Preparedness and Response under the Services button).
- If you are going to stay during a hurricane you need to ensure that you have sufficient food, water, and supplies for at least 5-7 days.
- Listen to NOAA Weather Radio or local radio or TV stations for instructions.

AFTER THE STORM:

- Follow steps outlined in the Hurricane Survival Guide.
- ▼ Call 9-1-1 for Emergencies only!
- In case of power outages, limit use of water in sinks and bathrooms. (If wastewater starts to back up in water closet, locate and remove plug on clean-out outside the house. Reinstall after power is restored.)

(The Checklists are meant to serve as a guideline for Hurricane Preparations and Recovery. It is not meant as an exclusive list of all actions that need to be considered.)

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The Greenacres C.A.R.E.S. program is now accepting new registrations for elementary school age children in need of year round care. This program is for working parents, who want a safe, affordable and structured environment for their child.


