The Leisure Services Department and the Greenacres Kiwanis Club have made special arrangements with Santa and his elves to enjoy breakfast



Our City is Growing

The Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR) has estimated the City's population as of April 1, 2006, at 31,734 people. This is an increase of 464 people over last year's final estimate of 31,270. This equates to a ratio of 1.8 persons per dwelling unit.



"Click It or Ticket It" Certification of Appreciation

The Public Safety Department received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Florida Department of Transportation for participating in the 2006 "Click It or Ticket" initiative. 🟂 Solid Waste Collection Rates 🔊



The City of Greenacres has a multi-year contract with Onyx Waste Services of Florida, Inc. for the collection of solid waste and recycling materials in the City. The City bills its customers, including many homeowner and condominium associations, each October 1st and April 1st for the next sixmonth period. The Onyx amended contract provides for an annual price adjustment based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the Miami-Fort Lauderdale area for June to June, with a ceiling rate of 4 percent and a fuel surcharge.

This rate increase adjustment is applied each October I billing period. The annual adjustment is applied for October 1st, 2006 solid waste bills, resulted in the following monthly rate changes:

These new rates remain one of the lowest solid waste residential collection rates in Palm Beach County.


