Greenacres Crime Rate is Down

On July 11, 2006, the State released the 2005 Annual Uniform Crime Report which reported that the State's index crime rate reached a 35year low. This is true for the crime rate in the City of Greenacres, which realized even a greater overall crime reduction than the State and Palm Beach County. Below is the crime rate reduction comparison for the years 2004 and 2005 between the State, Palm Beach County and Greenacres.

The Total Crime Index for Greenacres decreased from 1,592 in 2004 to 1,392 in 2005. The Crime Rate per population decreased from 52 per 1000 population in 2004 to 44 per 1000 population in 2005. This decrease in the crime rate is a goal that the Department of Public Safety continually works toward in an effort to provide the residents and businesses of Greenacres a safer community.

FY 2007 City Budget

The City Council will hold public hearings on September 6th and 18th at 7:00 p.m. to adopt a budget for fiscal year 2007 (October 1, 2006 – September 30, 2007). The City's total proposed (June 19, 2006) General Operating budget for FY 2007 is \$30,684,060, and is predicated on reducing the millage rate of the previous year by 0.42%. Millage is the tax rate levied by a city on taxable property per each \$1,000 of assessed taxable value.

The total City tax is \$5.5500 per \$1,000 of taxable value, which is slightly lower than last year. The chart below shows three examples of property values and how the City's millage rate affects each example for fiscal year 2007.

The City of Greenacres continues to have the lowest per capita tax of the ten largest cities in Palm Beach County. **Residents may notice an increase in their total tax bill over last year; this is due to the increase in the assessed value of their property.**

Where the \$30.7 million goes:

- Public Safety: \$10.4 million
- Administration/other General Government: \$2.8 million
- Public Works: \$2.7 million
- Engineering/Planning/Building: \$1.4 million
- Finance including Information Technology: \$1.3 million
- Leisure Services: \$.8 million
- Transfers to Capital and other projects: \$6.7 million
- Reserves: \$4.6 million 2007



Bird Flu - Just the Facts!

There are many stories currently in the news about the possible spread of bird flu to humans and the devastating effect the virus could have. While bird flu does pose a serious potential threat, it is important to be informed of the facts about the virus to prepare yourself and your family.

What is Avian Influenza (Bird Flu) Virus?

Avian influenza or "bird flu" is a virus that occurs naturally in a wild bird's intestine. It is very contagious among birds and can cause extreme illness or death in some domesticated birds such as chickens, ducks, and turkeys. The virus does not usually infect humans; however, several cases have been reported since 1997.

There are only three known subtypes of the virus that have infected humans. Avian flu poses two main risks to human health:

- A direct infection from poultry to humans (people who have contact with infected birds or surfaces that have been contaminated with secretions from infected birds). There are only a few strains of the virus that have crossed the barrier to infect humans; these are the cases reported in the news. The virus has not yet been passed from one human to another.
- The virus, given the right conditions, may mutate and become highly infectious for humans, then spread effortlessly from human to human (which has not happed as of now).

Has the virus entered the United States?

NO, World Health Organization laboratoryconfirmed human cases have thus far only been reported in:

Avian Bird Influenza (Bird Flu) is not in the United States!

Is it safe to eat poultry and poultry products?

YES. In areas free of the virus, poultry products can be prepared and consumed as usual. In areas with outbreaks (listed above), proper cooking and preparation of poultry will be adequate for safe consumption. Normal temperatures for cooking will kill the virus. Avian influenza is not transmitted through cooked food.

Is there treatment for human Avian Influenza?

There are two drugs, Oseltamivir (brand name Tamiflu) and Zanamivir (brand name Relenza), that can reduce the severity and duration of the illness if they are administered early enough.

Take precautions if a case of bird flu is reported in your area. Properly handle all food (especially poultry), wash your hands consistently with hot water and soap, and cook all meats to 70 C.

Actions Taken by the Governing Body (June and July 2006)

- Preliminarily approved the proposed FY 2007 Budget and Capital Improvements Program; public hearings will be held on September 6th and September 18th, 2006.
- Announced the proposed millage rate of 5.5500 mills for FY 2007 Budget, which is a reduction of .42% from FY 2006.
- Approved the Site and Development Plan for LaVita Gardens for a 26 unit townhouse development on 4.043 acres located on the south side of Dodd Road, just east of Jog Road.
- Approved the Site and Development Plan for the Tenth Avenue and Broward Offices to build a 4,989.5 square foot office building; subject property is located on the southeast corner of Tenth Avenue North and Broward Avenue.

Public Safety New Recording System

The Public Safety Department has completed the installation of a



new digital voice recording system. This system is capable of recording Public Safety radio transmission as well as the non-emergency and 911 telephone calls in the dispatch center. These saved recordings can be searched by date, 911 data, telephone line, or radio channel, and provided to authorized third parties such as the State Attorney's Office.

Awards Received



On June 6, 2006, PSO Rubin received an award for his DUI enforcement efforts with 115 arrests in 2005. The award was presented by the Palm Beach County

Traffic Safety Council at a luncheon held at the Palm Beach Airport Hilton.
