Happy New Year!

s we begin this New Year, it is important to reflect on the past year, the challenges that we faced and the goals that we accomplished. In 2008, unprecedented economic challenges included additional State mandated limitations on property tax revenues, declines in property values, collapse of the residential building market, and overall recessionary conditions that affected the City and the entire nation.

These conditions severely impacted the public and private sectors which saw layoffs, bankruptcies, and dramatic reductions in services. The City experienced continued declines in revenues and increases in fixed costs and was able to deal with these unprecedented challenges through years of efficient management, long term planning, and prioritization of essential services. Budget deficits were overcome without any layoffs or reductions in essential services. The City was also able to keep the 2009 property tax rates the same as 2008, which actually lowered property taxes due to the additional homestead exemption and tangible personal property exemption.

The City continued to provide the best services at the least cost due to the efficiency of government operations. The City's cost for government services remained the lowest at \$596 per resident among all similar sized cities in the County whose costs ranged from \$789 to \$1,402. Services and facilities were enhanced utilizing a variety of grants, and the City received national recognition for its budget and comprehensive annual financial report from the Government Finance Officers Association.

The City was again recognized as a "Tree City USA" by the National Arbor Day Foundation, and one of the "100 Best Communities for Young People" by America's Promise—The Alliance for Youth.

While the economic challenges will continue in 2009, we look forward to continuing to provide you with the best and most cost efficient public services.

DON'T BECOME A VICTIM

Did you know that you can help reduce property crimes and motor vehicle break-ins? You can also avoid becoming a victim by taking some simple actions to secure your residence and your vehicle.

Increase your home's security by doing the following:

- Install dead bolt locks on external doors.
- Secure sliding glass doors and windows with track locks and/or pin locks.
- Reinforce the sliding glass door's security with upper flush mount locks or a heavy wood dowel in the tracks.
- Never hide keys outside; most burglars know where to look.
- Deter burglars with an alarm system that monitors doors and windows.
- Use light sensors and timers at different times to make it appear as if someone is home.
- Keep a list of serial numbers and purchase prices in a secure location for easy reference in case of a loss.
- Keep shrubbery trimmed and pathways well lit to avoid places for concealment.

A majority of thefts occurring from vehicles happen due to complacency. In a recent rash of women's purses being snatched from vehicles, it was discovered that in nearly every case, the car was left unlocked while the victim ran into a daycare or convenience store. Some steps to be taken to minimize vehicle thefts include:

- Never leave valuables or sensitive information visible in your vehicle.
- Always lock your vehicle.
- Do not leave a garage door opener in your vehicle; it gives access to your garage and/or home.

You can avoid being a victim by following some simple precautions by being more aware and vigilant of strangers or unusual

CITY COUNCIL ACTIONS

The following are highlights of actions taken by the City Council at their meetings, from September through December 2008.

- Received a Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery Initiative Supplemental Appropriation in the amount of \$225,000 for a new storm water outfall at Bowman Street to mitigate storm water drainage issues brought about by Hurricane Wilma.
- Received a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program Grant in the amount of \$108,500 for the "Greenacres Freedom Park Soccer Field", located on Pinehurst Drive.
- Authorized submittal of a grant application to Palm Beach County to fund the purchase of four (4) Glydescope Rangers in the amount of \$43,880 to be placed in advanced life support ambulances for the improvement and expansion of emergency medical services within Greenacres.
- Authorized the FY 2009 Greenacres Little League Agreement for use of the City's ballfields and facilities.
- Received a grant in the amount of \$291,930 for the Greenacres Youth Programs from the Children Services Council of Palm Beach County.
- Received a \$5,000 donation from Palms West Chamber of Commerce for the Youth Athletic Scholarship fund.

- Adopted an operating budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30, 2009.
- Approved adoption of amendments to the Fire Prevention and Protection Code.
- Approved a Lease Agreement between the City of Greenacres and State of Florida Department of Health, Palm Beach County Health Department, for the lease of premises at 5985 10th Avenue North, Greenacres (former City Hall).
- Approved a Special Exception and site plan for a standalone car wash facility, located on the northeast corner of Melaleuca Lane and Wellman Trail.

CITY POPULATION - UPDATE

The City received notification from the Florida Bureau of Economic and Business Research

(BEBR) that the population estimate was 32,548 as of April 2008. This figure represents an increase of 443 people from last year's estimate.

COMPREHENSIVE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT AWARD (CAFR)

The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting has been awarded to the City of Greenacres by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

The City of Greenacres is honored by the attainment of this distinguished award for the seventeenth (17th) consecutive year.

JOG ROAD MEDIAN ENHANCEMENTS

The Public Works Roads & Drainage Division has been busy beautifying one of the City's busiest thoroughfares. The medians on Jog Road, from Summit Boulevard to Lake Worth Road, have received aesthetic enhancements that serve a dual purpose - beautification and an overall reduction of maintenance costs.

Over the past year, approximately 59,900 square feet of sod; 3,393 red, pink, purple, yellow, and white Bougainvillea plants; and 1,200 Cocoplum plants have been planted.



COMMUNTIY PARK PATHWAY TO PINEHURST DRIVE

Work has been completed on the construction of an approximately 1,500 foot long pedestrian and bicycle pathway from Community Park to Pinehurst Drive. The project was funded through the Federal TEA-21 grant program via the Palm Beach County Metropolitan Planning Organization and the Florida Department of Transportation. The project consisted of an 8 foot wide asphalt path, landscaping, lighting, and included fencing along the adjacent canal which had been installed previously by the Palm Beach County Water Utilities Department. The Utilities Department also provided the landscape architectural services for the project as part of a cooperative effort with the City.

RESURFACING OF FOREST HILL BOULEVARD

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has awarded a contract to resurface Forest Hill Boulevard from Pinehurst Drive east to I-95. The project generally entails



milling off the existing asphalt and installing new asphalt, as well as, the replacement of the traffic signals with mast arms and some median work in the eastern segment of the project. Median landscaping will be installed where the project runs through Greenacres, Palm Springs, and Lake Clarke Shores. The intersection of Jog Road and Forest Hill Boulevard will not be resurfaced since this area is planned for significant modification by Palm Beach County. The portion from Haverhill Road east to I-95 will start in early January and take 292 days. The portion from Pinehurst Drive east to Haverhill Road begins in mid February and will take 231 days.

CODE ENFORCEMENT—How does it work?


The following is a general overview of the code enforcement process, the functions of the Code Enforcement Board, and the duties of Code Enforcement Officers.

The City's code enforcement process follows the requirements of Chapter 162 of the Florida Statutes.

The process was established in order to address possible code violations (such as sanitation, nuisances, building regulations, fire prevention and protection, licenses and business regulations, etc.).

To insure minimum standards are being upheld, the City's Code Enforcement Officers have the responsibility to conduct inspections and make determinations on their findings.

 If a violation is found to exist at the time of the inspection, the property owner will be notified. The notification includes a time frame for the violation to be corrected. Code Enforcement Officers will then inspect the violation again. If the violation has been corrected the case is CLOSED. If the violation has **NOT** been corrected:



- At the hearing, the Code Enforcement Board will hear sworn testimony from the property owners and the Code Enforcement Officers.
- If the Board finds that the violation does exist, the Board will issue orders to bring the violation into compliance.
- The Board may extend the time allotted for correction of the violation, or may impose a fine of up to \$250.00 per day (or \$500.00 per day for repeat violations) for each day the violation remains uncorrected.
- A certified copy of the Board's Order imposing a fine may be recorded in the public records of Palm Beach County.

All procedures and determinations are based on the intent of the City Code, which is to maintain minimum standards that promote and protect the well being of City residents and businesses.




