The 100 Best designation recognizes those communities that make youth a priority by implementing programs that help keep children in school and prepare them for college and the 21st century workforce.

The efforts of Greenacres' civic and community leaders were honored by America's Promise Alliance. Marguerite W. Kondracke, America's Promise Alliance president and CEO, said "Through its innovative and farreaching programs, Greenacres is taking bold and effective steps to help their young people graduate and lead healthy, productive lives. Greenacres serves as an example to inspire and educate other communities across the nation to tackle the challenges facing their city and children, and to implement initiatives that give them the essential resources they need to succeed in life."

Greenacres focuses on young people during its community planning process and creates safe spaces for them to learn and grow, engaging young people in the policy making process through youth advisory councils. Making young people a priority in Greenacres is also evident in the city's cross-sector collaborations with the City Council, local schools, and other communitybased organizations.

The local Community Center offers structured programs that concentrate on academic enrichment and include tutoring and youth athletics. Hot Spot, a high school initiative that provides career exploration and college tours, weekend activities and community service projects help young people meet graduation requirements.

The following are highlights of actions taken by the City Council at their meetings from July through December, 2010.

- Approved a Site Plan for construction of a Produce Market to be located at 549-561 Broward Avenue.
- Approved a Special Exception to allow for a House of Worship to be located at 4889 Lake Worth Road.
- Awarded a bid to ARZ Builders for improvements to Veterans Park located on Purdy Lane.
- Authorized the FY 2011 Agreement for the Greenacres Little League for the use of City Ball Fields and Facilities.
- Authorized the 2010-2011 Family Central, Inc. of Palm Beach County "Continue-to-Care Afterschool Rate Agreement", that provides funding for the Afterschool Program.
- Awarded a contract to Staffing Connection to provide School Crossing Guards for all elementary and middle schools located in the City.
- Authorized a contract with Fun Sports, Inc. for coordination of the City's Youth Athletic Program which includes youth basketball, flag football and soccer.

- Awarded bids for the supply and installation of nine HVAC systems at Community Hall, Public Safety Station 1, Public Safety Station 2, and the Leisure Services Building to Cedars Electro-Mechanical, DAC Air Conditioning, and Koldaire.
- Accepted the "100 Best Communities for Young People" Award from ING America's Promise Alliance.
- Adopted an operating budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2011.
- ➤ Approved the annexation of 10 parcels of land totaling 8.45 acres located on the west side of South Military Trail, north of Lake Worth Road.
- Approved a resolution in support of implementing the Let's Move Campaign to fight childhood obesity as set forth by the First Lady, Michelle Obama.

## SAVE ON PRESCRIPTION DRUGS WITH OUR NEW PRESCRIPTION DISCOUNT CARD

The City of Greenacres has a new program to offer savings on prescription drugs to residents who are without health insurance, a traditional benefits plan, or have prescriptions that are not covered by insurance. The Prescription Discount Card is made available to residents by the City of Greenacres in collaboration with the National League of Cities (NLC) and is made possible through membership in NLC. The card is Free to all City of Greenacres residents, regardless of age, income or existing health insurance. By using this card you may save an average of 20% off the regular retail price of prescription drugs at participating pharmacies. Residents may also pick up a card at City Hall or the Community Center.

### CITY PARTNERS WITH PROJECT LIFESAVER

Project Lifesaver utilizes Tracking Technology to locate wandering individuals with psychological disorders (*Autism, Alzheimer's, Dementia*). The City of Greenacres recently partnered with Project Lifesaver and received equipment and training necessary to locate program participants reported missing by their caregivers.


The radio technology equipment receives VHF signals transmitted from a participant's wristband. Officers certified as Electronic Search Specialists and trained to operate the equipment will respond to the last known area the person was seen and start searching with the mobile locator tracking system.

The Department of Public Safety has trained individuals on each of the four (4) shifts and the Crime Prevention Officer. In addition, Dispatch personnel will be able to access a website to retrieve the participant's personal information to aid in such an emergency. Having the personnel and equipment will help in rapid recovery, and increase the success of finding the person quickly; an essential factor for the safety of the individual. ## COMPREHENSIVE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT AWARD (CAFR)

The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting has been awarded to the City of Greenacres by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

The CAFR has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR. The GFOA is a nonprofit professional association serving approximately 16,000 government finance professionals with offices in Chicago, IL, and Washington, D.C.

## RIGHT TREE, RIGHT PLACE



Trees come in all shapes and sizes, and often change dramatically over their lifetimes. Some grow tall, some grow wide and some have extensive root systems. Before selecting your tree, do some research - make sure you know how tall, wide and deep it will be at maturity. Where you plant your tree is just as important as what type of tree you plant. Blocking an unsightly view or creating some shade may be a priority, but you must also think about how your tree will impact existing overhead and underground utility lines, sidewalks, or driveways as it grows taller, wider and deeper. If you aren't sure what's underground, call the free underground utility line locator service by dialing 8-1-1. Taking the time to consider location now can prevent avoidable expenses for years to come.

#### STORMWATER RUNOFF

Stormwater runoff results when rain falls on surfaces that cannot absorb it such as pavement or rooftops, or ground that is already saturated from rain. This rain flows overland toward stormwater inlets, swales, ditches, canals, lakes, wetlands, or coastal waters. Most of the unwanted pollutants that end up on our waterbodies come from human activities. By knowing the facts and being aware, you can help clean up our lakes and waterways. Always remember, nothing but stormwater belongs in the storm drains.

The City was officially incorporated in 1926, and today is the 10th largest of the 38 cities in the County, with a population of 32,267!



he City of Greenacres has a Public Protection Classification (PPC) of 3 for residential and commercial properties as determined by the Insurance Services Offices (ISO) which assigns a classification from 1 to 10 with 1 representing superior property fire protection. Out of 759 communities in the State of Florida only 40 have a classification better than 3, 83 have a classification of 3 and all the others have lower classifications. The City's PPC of 3 represents an excellent fire protection classification with lower premiums for property insurance.

he City received notification by the University of Florida Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR) that their estimate of the City's population as of April 2010, is 32,267. BEBR provides city and county population estimates for use by the State for revenue sharing.
