Highlights Inside !

As we look forward to 2015, we do so with a sense of optimism about our City and its future with a focus on continuing to improve the quality of life and providing the best services at the least cost to our residents and businesses.



With the "Great Recession" now in the rearview mirror, major segments of the economy like housing and construction are continuing to recover with home prices appreciating and home builders increasing efforts to meet the demand for new homes. Property owners of some vacant parcels are moving forward with applications for new commercial developments and many businesses have renovated their existing stores.

The City's budget for 2015 provided funding for continuing to enhance Public Safety Services by adding personnel, renovating facilities and continuing investment in information technology. In 2015, the 911 dispatch center is scheduled to be completely renovated inside the Public Safety Headquarters to include adding space and installing new equipment and furnishings. Additional law enforcement software will be added to enhance crime analysis, printers will be upgraded in police patrol vehicles, several law enforcement vehicles will be replaced and EMS stretchers will be replaced in Ambulances.

In 2015, the City will continue with projects that focus on infrastructure expansion and upgrades and include; starting the Original Section storm sewer enhancement to reduce flooding, resurfacing Martin and Perry Avenues south of 10th Avenue North and continuing with storm water pipe rehabilitation throughout the City. In the area of Parks and Recreation, the largest project includes the construction of an 11,000 square foot expansion to the Greenacres

Community Center to add classroom space and administrative offices for the Leisure Services Department. Ongoing upgrades to park facilities will continue and include replacement of sports turf at Freedom, Ira Van Bullock and Veterans Parks, renovation of the restroom facilities at Ira Van Bullock and Community Parks, resurfacing the parking areas around Community Hall and upgrading the pathway and parking lot lights at Freedom Park.

2015 will bring some challenges, the biggest of which are in the form of Federal and State unfunded mandates that require local governments to implement new Federal and State laws at a significant cost to our residents. As we have done in the past, we will continue to work on maintaining the City's fiscal health and low property tax rates and providing the best services at the least cost to our residents.

Traditions abound with the beginning of a New Year and the most important of these is the hope and possibility for a brighter future in the year to come. Whatever your traditions are for the New Year, our City Council and staff wish you the best throughout 2015.

Council Actions

The following are highlights of actions taken by the City Council at their meetings from July through December, 2014.

- Established a taxable valuation and levied an ad valorem tax on property located within the corporate limits of Greenacres, Florida for the year ending December 31, 2014; and adopted an operating budget for Fiscal Year 2015 beginning October 1, 2014 and ending September 30, 2015.
- Ratified the Collective Bargaining Unit (CBU) Agreement with the Police Benevolent Association (PBA) for Police Officers and Emergency Communications Personnel through September 2016.
- Ratified a Collective Bargaining Unit (CBU) Agreement with the International Association of Firefighters (IAFF) Local 2928 for Fire Rescue Personnel for the period October 2014 -September 2017.
- Approved a 3-year contract with Dr. Kenneth Scheppke to provide services as the City's Medical Director to the City's Fire Rescue Division.
- Received awards from the Government Finance Officers' Association (GFOA) for the FY 2013 Budget including the "Distinguished Budget Presentation Award", the "Special Performance Recognition Award" and the "Certificate of

Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Award".

- Approved an agreement with Architecture Green, LLC, for architectural design services for expansion of the Community Center.
- Approved a Special Exception and Site Plan to construct a wireless communication cell tower on the Municipal Complex site and authorized a 20year lease agreement with RG Towers, LLC.
- Adopted a code text amendment to Chapter 8, Contractor License Requirements, to facilitate the City's participation in the County-wide Contractor Enrollment Program.
- Authorized the FY 2015 contract with the Florida Department of Corrections to provide work squads to the City.
- Authorized the FY 2015 Agreement with the Greenacres Little League for the use of City ball fields and facilities.
- Approved an interlocal agreement with Palm
 Beach County for Information Technology (IT)
 Network Services.

2014 Municipal General Election Notice



The City of Greenacres Municipal General Election is scheduled for Tuesday, March 10, 2015, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. City voters will have the opportunity to elect candidates for the Office of the Mayor and Council Districts I and V.

The candidate qualifying/filing period begins at noon on January 27, 2015 and ends at noon on February 10, 2015.

To register to vote, a Voter Registration Form needs to be completed and submitted to the PBC Supervisor of Elections Office. The forms are available at City Hall and online at www.pbcelections.org. The deadline to register to vote in the Municipal Election is at noon on February 9, 2015.

Voters choosing to cast their vote by Absentee Ballot, may submit an online request on the PBC Supervisor of Elections' website at www.pbcelections.org, make a request by phone at (561) 656-6200 or by fax at (561) 656-6220. Carefully read the instructions for absentee ballots and be sure to sign the back of the ballot, apply the correct postage and submit the ballot to ensure receipt by the Supervisor of Elections Office prior to 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Online Payment Options Now Available for the City's Leisure Services Department



Customers are now able to pay online (with Visa or MasterCard) for programs and events offered through our Leisure Services Department. Area of Hope grant builds After School classrooms in Greenacres



The City of Greenacres After School Services can now serve up to 150 children in its newly renovated facilities, thanks to a Special Area of Hope grant from Palm Beach County. The \$322,000 grant, provided through the Department of Economic Sustainability (DES) under the Community Development Block Grant program, was applied toward the \$466,000 remodeling project of the City's Community Hall and Perry buildings.

Improvements were made to child care classrooms, a secure public lobby, administrative offices, kitchen and restrooms, all with impact-resistant windows and doors shaded by awnings.

The year-round programs offer activities and academic assistance for students in elementary through high school grades, including an intergenerational garden club.

The Special Area of Hope funds were established by the Board of County Commissioners in 2001 and are a portion of CDBG funds distributed each year to one of eight block grant entitlement municipalities in Palm Beach County.

Enjoy Your Favorite Foods Responsibly

All home cooking oils such as frying oil, bacon and hamburger drippings, can cause problems in home plumbing, sewage collection systems and septic systems. If you're frying foods, the last thing you should do is dump that used cooking oil down any



drain. It can gel and solidify into thick layers, even if you run hot water. It can possibly back up home plumbing and lift stations. That's messy, smelly and costly to clean up!

Here's a better idea; recycle it at the Solid Waste Authority of Palm Beach County.

- Allow the used cooking oil to cool.
- Carefully pour the used, cooled cooking oil into a large, sturdy plastic or wax-coated leak proof container, such as the original container or a juice carton, no larger than 5-gallons in size.
- Cap the container so it is secure.
- Don't mix the used cooking oil with any other liquids or products.
- Take it to one of Solid Waste Authority's Home Chemical and Recycling Centers.

Fire Prevention Tips

Heating equipment is a leading cause of home fire deaths. Half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February. Some simple steps can prevent most heating-related fires from happening.



- Keep anything that can burn at least three (3) feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.



In October, the Greenacres Department of Public Safety held its second National Night Out Against Crime Celebration at the Target store located at 5900 Lake Worth Road. The Greenacres Department of Public Safety teamed up with the Palm Springs Police Department, the Atlantis Police Department, the Florida Highway Patrol, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, and with Target and other local agencies and businesses. The National Night Out Against Crime began in 1984 as the traditional "lights on" campaign and symbolic front porch vigils which turned into a celebration across America with various events and activities across the country. The National Night Out Against Crime is an effort to promote involvement in crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships, neighborhood watch and send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. The event

included crime prevention and safety information to the citizens along with activities for the children. It was estimated that over 450 citizens attended the event.

National Flood Insurance Program Flood Maps - Update

In the September 2014 issue of this publication we reported that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has been working on updating the Flood Insurance Rate Maps for all areas in Palm Beach County. The Preliminary Flood Maps showed many areas of the City north of Lake Worth Road to be in special flood hazard areas. The City questioned the accuracy of the preliminary FEMA Flood Maps especially when many subdivisions were built in compliance with the South Florida Water Management District's requirements to have finished floor elevations above the 100-year flood stage. When the new flood maps become official, they may affect many residents and businesses subjecting them to new regulations and the possibility of having to **INSURANCE PROGRAM** purchase flood insurance, some at a significant cost.



To ensure the accuracy of the information used by FEMA, the City has undertaken an aerial topographic mapping project of the City which is currently underway. The topographic information will show the elevations of structures and surrounding areas and will be provided to FEMA in digital form for their use in updating the Preliminary Flood Maps. The City has also participated in efforts led by Palm Beach County, the City of West Palm Beach, and the South Florida Water Management District to update the system performance study of the main drainage artery in our area - the C-51 Canal.

FEMA will be going through the process of finalizing the Flood Maps which are currently projected to become effective in December 2015. The Flood Insurance Rate Maps show buildings, structures, special flood hazard areas and base flood elevations. Buildings and structures shown within the special flood hazard areas that have a mortgage obtained through a federally regulated or insured lender, will be required to purchase a flood insurance policy. Avoid Distracted Walking/Riding

The City of Greenacres and the State of Florida as a whole have realized a growing pattern in the area of pedestrian safety. Pedestrian deaths and injuries due to traffic crashes are steadily growing. The Greenacres Public Safety Department wants to remind all residents to use care when walking or riding bicycles. Obey all traffic laws, look several times before crossing roadways, and do not walk/ride while distracted by cell phones or anything else. We also encourage drivers to be aware of distracted pedestrians and to not drive distracted themselves. They may not see or hear you coming, so do not assume that they are aware of your presence or intentions. Through team work and a continued focus on safety we can all reduce the deaths and injuries related to traffic crashes on all levels.

Greenacres Historical Society Museum





- The annual registration fee is \$30 per student.




